

PROJECT UPDATE: August 7, 2009

King County's contractor for the Bellevue Pump Station Upgrade project has recently completed installation of the temporary pump station system which includes the temporary electrical building, odor control unit, pumps, and standby generator. The temporary pump station will provide continued wastewater service while the existing pump station and generator buildings are taken out of service and demolished. Demolition of the existing pump station and generator is expected to take place sometime in the fall.

Upcoming construction activities:

- Operational testing of the temporary pump station
- Demolition of existing pump station and generator buildings
- Ongoing erosion control and settlement monitoring

What to expect

 Continued construction activities weekdays between 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. Neighbors will be given advance notice of any construction activities that may require extended work hours.

King County is upgrading the Bellevue Pump Station to protect public health and the environment. The existing pump station is more than 40 years old and must be expanded to accommodate Bellevue's growing wastewater treatment needs. King County is committed to being a good neighbor.
