## Bellevue sewer upgrade project along SE Third Street and 102nd Avenue SE

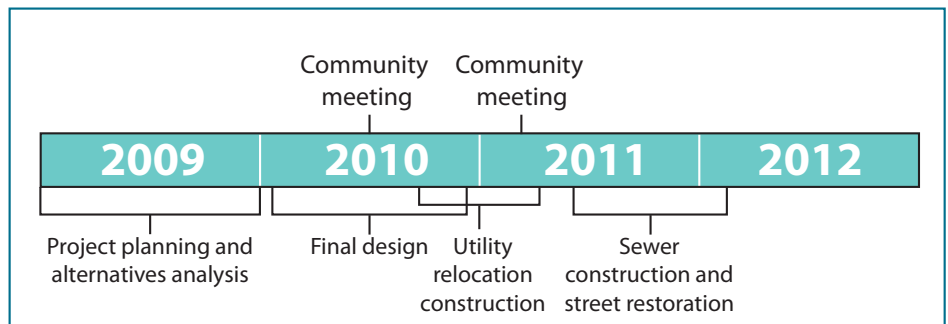
In 2011, the King County Wastewater Treatment Division and the City of Bellevue will upgrade 45-year old sewer trunk lines along SE Third Street and 102nd Avenue SE in Bellevue.

King County protects public health and the environment by conveying and treating the region's wastewater through a complex and integrated system of sewer pipes, pump stations, and treatment plants. Much of the region's sewer system is more than 40 years old and needs to be upgraded to accommodate growth and to continue to provide safe, reliable sewer service.

The King County Bellevue Influent Trunk and the City of Bellevue West Central Business District (CBD) Trunk lines will be upgraded to provide the required capacity to accommodate recent and projected growth in Bellevue. The Bellevue Influent Trunk carries approximately ten million gallons per day of wastewater from the downtown Bellevue area to the Bellevue Pump Station on SE Sixth Street, and eventually to the South Treatment Plant in Renton. The existing sewer line is corroded and has reached maximum capacity.

### Anticipated Project Schedule

- Community meetings will be held during project design and prior to start of construction.
- Utility relocation construction: relocation of utilities (PSE, Comcast, and Qwest) is anticipated to begin fall of 2010 and should take 5-6 months to complete.
- Sewer upgrade construction is anticipated to begin spring of 2011 and last 10-12 months.

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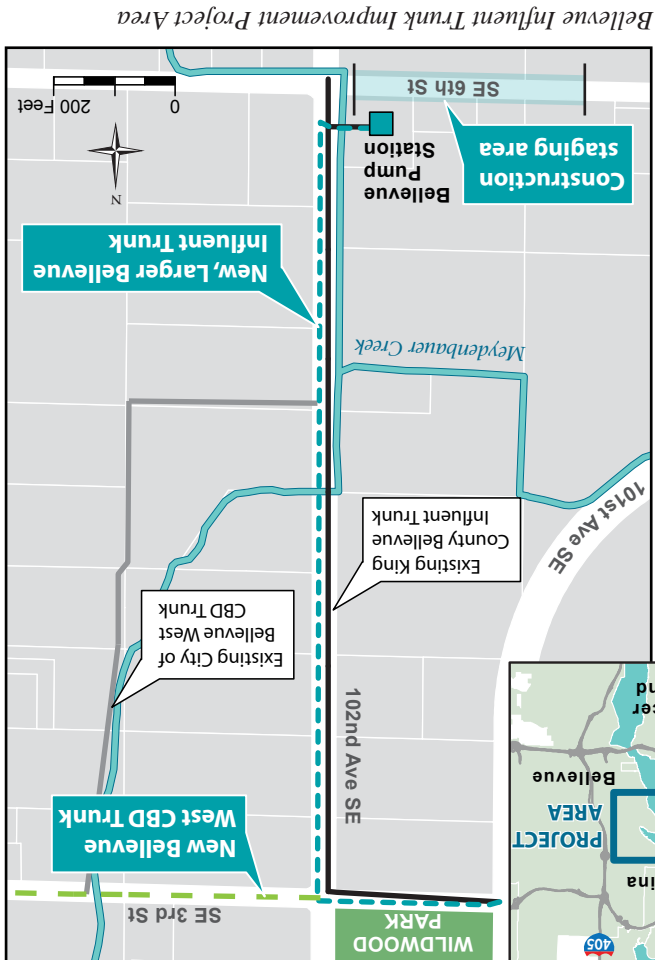
