Stations

- Lighting
- Fencing and northwest corner
- Vegetation and views
- Building and odor control stacks





Lighting

- 1. How would you characterize the current lighting?
 - · Industrial, low, spilling into surrounding area
- 2. How could lighting enhance or detract from the neighborhood?
- 3. How might you change the lighting, if you wanted to?
 - · Would lighting changes vary around the property?

Fencing and northwest corner

- 1. What is your preference on the purpose of fencing for the area?
 - · Security fencing for the entire site
 - Security fencing for the "core area" and "soft" fencing to delineate the property line
- 2. The northwest corner of the site may not be used for the facility features. If it is not behind a security fence, what are your opportunities or concerns for this area?
 - Examples: Pathway, connection to the park, transition area, rain garden
- 3. What is your preference for fence types? Why?
 - · Security: vertical rod, chain link, screen
 - · Soft: split rail, wood framed wire, picket

Vegetation and views

- 1. What is your preference on the purpose of vegetation and landscaping and how it interacts with neighboring views?
 - Provide color and open views ("garden" feel)
 - Blend into the park, preserve existing views ("tree'd" feel)
 - · Screen the new facility
- 2. What are your preferences and dislikes about the example plant palette and landscapes shown? Why?
- 3. What other places are good examples of vegetation and landscaping that you like?

Building and odor control stacks

- 1. Think about the new building. Would you like it to be:
 - Iconic a statement building?
 - Blend in with the surrounding neighborhood/landscape?
 - Disappear to the extent possible?
- 2. Think about the new odor control stacks. Would you like them to be:
 - Iconic a statement or artistic structure?
 - · Blend in with or match the building?
 - · Disappear or disguised to the extent possible?
- 3. What are your preferences and dislikes of the sample materials shown? Why?
