



## Project Update - August 11, 2016

Hello from King County –

The project contractor is now working to connect the existing sewer pipe under N.W. Canal St. to the new siphons. The new siphons were recently installed under the Ship Canal.

Crews are using excavators and jackhammers to demolish part of the existing 9-foot diameter sewer pipe. The pipe must be removed so that a new connecting structure can be built in its place. Crews will work this Saturday, August 13 to finish opening the pipe.

Normal sewer service will continue. Sewage and stormwater that would normally flow through the pipe under N.W. Canal St. has been shifted to a temporary bypass pipe while this work occurs.

### What to expect

- Work on Saturday, August 13 from 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.
- Increased noise and vibration during jackhammer work
- Occasional sewer odors while the pipe interior is exposed
- No disruptions to normal sewer service
