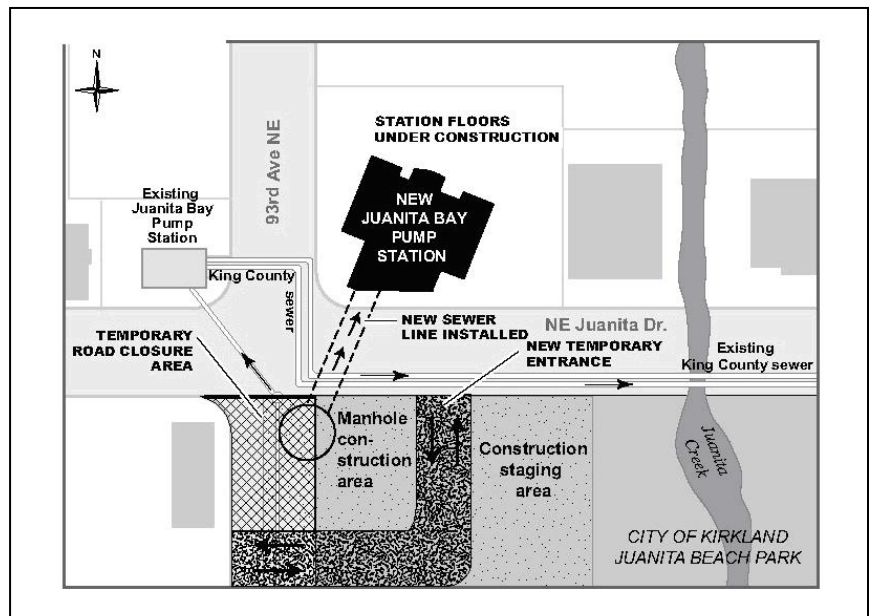
## ***Crews to remove steel piles at Juanita Bay Pump Station during week of July 2***

### ***Vibration and noise increases likely July 2-3. Work site closed July 4.***

King County crews will remove steel sheet piles used as shoring for air ducts at the new Juanita Bay Pump Station during the week of July 2, 2007. The work should be completed by July 3. Crews will not be working at the site on the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday.

In May, crews installed steel piles nearly 30 feet below grade to aid with excavation for the air ducts. Removing the piles requires the use of a vibrating hammer which is likely to increase levels of noise and vibration early in the week. King County's contractor is closely monitoring vibration levels to minimize disruption and protect against property damage.

After removing the piles, crews will continue work on the below grade pump station structure at the corner of Northeast Juanita Drive and 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Northeast.



King County is building the new wastewater pump station to help ensure your community receives safe, reliable wastewater service for the next 50 years.

#### ***What should you expect?***

- Increased noise and vibration from the work area beginning July 2, 2007.
- Work hours will generally remain 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. on weekdays, and 9 a.m. – 6 p.m. on Saturdays as necessary.
