


Juanita Bay Pump Station Replacement Project CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

March 2006

To improve the safety and reliability of our operations and provide wastewater capacity for the future, the King County Wastewater Treatment Division is replacing the Juanita Bay Pump Station in Kirkland.


We're making progress...and intense activity continues!

Thank for your patience during the past few months of construction. Since last November, King County's contractor has been drilling secant piles (70-foot-deep vertical holes filled with concrete) for the pump station foundation. The



contractor has been experiencing challenges with the drilling operation, and work is behind schedule. Long hours and occasional night work have been required.

King County and the contractor are actively working to resolve problems and recover time on the schedule. A second drilling rig was brought to the site in mid-January to help speed progress. Secant piling activities will last through spring 2006. The pump station foundation will then be excavated, and soil will be hauled from the site by trucks and trailers (up to 100 per day) for several weeks.



What can you expect?

With two drilling rigs operating on the site, neighbors can expect more noise and activity at the site. During the secant piling installation, you can expect the contractor to work:

- 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday - Friday
- 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
 Saturday

Note: Adverse weather

or equipment breakdowns may require the contractor to work until 8 p.m. some evenings, as allowed by the building permit. Work after 8 p.m. or on Sundays will only be performed in the event of an emergency.

Coming this spring: microtunneling a new sewer pipe

A new sewer pipe will be tunneled under Northeast Juanita Drive, from the construction staging area in Juanita Beach Park to the new pump station (see map). A remotely-controlled tunneling machine will be used to install the new pipe, allowing the road to remain open.

Workers will spend several months building an access shaft in the construction staging area, putting in support walls to hold back the soil while the dirt inside the hole is removed. The shaft will be approximately 40 feet wide and 40 feet deep. The tunneling machine

will be placed in the shaft and begin installing a five-foot-diameter sewer pipe under the road. The actual tunneling operation is expected to take several weeks. The machine will then be removed from inside the pump station foundation.
