

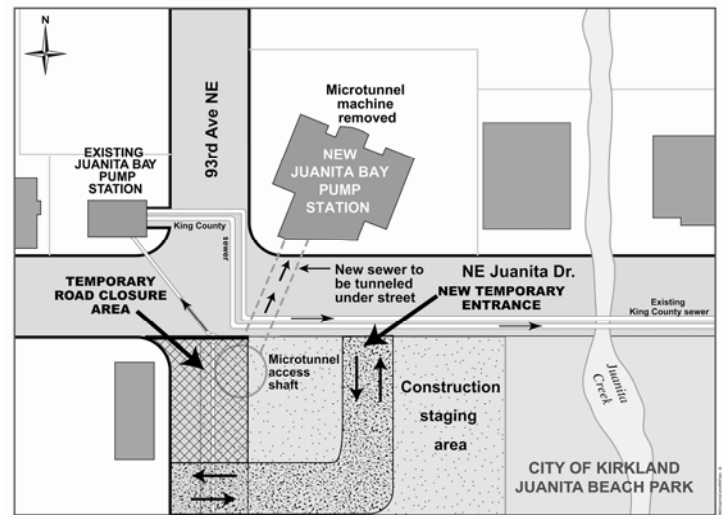

## ***Microtunneling nears completion --extended work hours required during final push***

King County's contractor has completed microtunneling of a new sewer pipe under Northeast Juanita Drive. During the week of October 23, 2006 the contractor will dig a hole inside the pump station foundation to retrieve the microtunneling machine.

To safeguard the site's integrity and limit the potential impact on existing groundwater, the contractor may need to work beyond regular working hours, and may possibly have to continue work around the clock for one or two nights.

We recognize that extended work hours are not preferable to many of our neighbors and we have worked hard to avoid them. In this case, extended hours offer our contractor the best chance to complete work quickly, safely and responsibly. We will do all we can to minimize inconveniences to the neighborhood and will continue to update you as events transpire.
