King Street Odor Control Project Update - June 12, 2008

Shoring installation south of King Street Station begins June 16

Most of the odor control equipment to be installed during this project will be located underground in the construction zone between King Street Station and the Weller Street Bridge. To stabilize the site for excavation, King County's contractor will insert steel sheets approximately 60 feet into the ground along the excavation area boundaries.

Crews will begin installing sheets during the week of June 16. The work will occur weekdays from 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. and last about two weeks.

Community members can expect increased noise from construction activities during work hours. King County's contractor will closely monitor vibration levels to minimize disruption and protect against property damage.

To protect public safety, pedestrians should remain alert and cautious when passing near the construction zone. All access into the construction zone should be coordinated with King County's project team in advance.

What to Expect

- Increased noise and activity in the construction zone between King Street Station and the Weller Street Bridge on weekdays from 7 a.m. - 5 p.m. beginning June 16
- Cranes, large equipment and additional crews working on site

King County is committed to being a good neighbor during construction. The project team will work with community members to minimize disruptions to the daily lives of those living and working near the construction zone.
