

Crews working Saturday, Aug. 22; Pump station connection work underway

King County contractors will be working on the project's underground storage tank this Saturday, Aug. 22 from 9 a.m. - 6 p.m. Some machinery may access Beach Dr. S.W. to transport equipment and materials from the staging area in Lowman Beach Park to the tank site across the street.

In addition, crews have begun installing a new five-foot pipe in Lowman Beach Park to connect the new underground storage tank to the Murray Pump Station (see map). This work will continue through early fall.

After the pipe is installed in the park, work will shift to the 7000 block of Beach Dr. S.W. Excavators will be used to install steel sheets and beams to hold soil and water back during pipe installation. **Expect increased noise while these activities occur.**

This work will close one lane of Beach Dr. S.W. entirely, with the remaining lane available for local traffic, emergency and service vehicles only. Expect traffic delays of up to 15 minutes on the 7000 block of Beach Dr. S.W. during work hours. **Park users or others parking between the project areas on the 7000 block of Beach Dr. S.W. risk being ticketed and towed during this phase of work.** More information will be provided prior to the start of lane closures.



To protect public safety, the following vehicle and pedestrian restrictions will remain in effect on Beach Dr. S.W.:

- Vehicle access for local, emergency and service traffic only
- Bicyclists will be asked to walk their bikes through the area during work hours
- Pedestrians are being directed to the western sidewalk around the work area

What to expect:

- Work from 7:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. weekdays and from 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, Aug. 22
- Crews working on Beach Dr. S.W. and inside the underground storage tank area
- Increased noise, truck traffic, congestion, and traffic delays on streets near the project site
- No parking on the 7000 block of Beach Dr. S.W.
- Flaggers and signs directing traffic on Beach Dr. S.W. and at the intersection with 48th Ave. S.W.
- Pedestrian traffic will be directed to the west sidewalk on Beach Dr. S.W.
- Bicyclists will be asked to dismount when passing through the 7000 block of Beach Dr. S.W.
- Steel sheets may be used to cover trenches after hours. Bicyclists should use extreme caution
