



Project update

Contractor expected to finish work in April, King County will raise safety railing in May to protect public safety

Restoration of the Murray CSO Control Project site is nearly complete. King County's contractor will finish the remaining project work by the end of April, including:

- **On-site landscaping:** The contractor will plant new grass at the base of the public staircase. This work is weather dependent.
- **Restoration of Lowman Beach Park:** New irrigation is being installed and grass will be planted. The temporary fencing around the park will remain up through spring until the grass is established.
- **Project art:** The project artist, Robert Horner, will be sealing the rammed earth walls and installing art inlays and rock gardens along the public staircase.

The contractor will remove construction fencing and open the public staircase after this work is complete. Railings were recently installed around the rain garden and on the facility roof near public viewpoints. To protect public safety, the County will be raising the height of these railings. This work will occur during the month of May. Temporary barriers will be in place on the facility roof until the new railings can be installed.

Fence art available for reuse

The plywood art boards that decorated the construction fence for nearly three years are available to the community for reuse. What to expect this spring

The County will host a community event at the site later this spring to celebrate completion of the project and to thank the community for your continued patience during construction. At the event there will be an opportunity to go inside the facility building and see the equipment used to operate the underground storage tank. Keep an eye out for an invite in the mail!
