King County's North Beach Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) Control project team invites you to a meeting hosted by the Blue Ridge Board on June 11, 2012, from 7:00-8:00 p.m. at the Blue Ridge Clubhouse, 10040 15th Avenue Northwest. All interested community members are invited to attend.

At this meeting, you can:

- Review architectural and landscape concepts for the restored North Beach Pump Station site
- Learn about elements being considered in the street improvement process, including lighting, road reconfiguration, and green stormwater infrastructure
- Hear about options for construction staging areas
- Ask questions and provide feedback about the architectural and landscape concepts

King County recently hosted a design workshop on May 12. The project team received valuable feedback and preferences from attendees on the look and feel of the North Beach site and elements being considered for the right of way. If you missed the May 12 workshop, this meeting provides a second opportunity to preview these concepts. You can get more information, ask the team questions, and give the team your thoughts.
