Weekly Construction Update – June 18, 2015

Crews continue working to connect wastewater infrastructure elements on-site, including the new combined sewer overflow (CSO) tank to the North Beach Pump Station, and installing new manholes.

Crews will be working this Saturday, June 20. Thanks for your continued patience and understanding with all of the activity on site.

Utility work

The contractor continues to work with utility companies to schedule and implement relocation of water, power, and gas lines. Puget Sound Energy (PSE) and Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) will be on-site next week. During this work:

- Take note of “no parking” signs utility may post when they are working in the project area.
- Utility agencies may have vehicles, crews, and equipment on or near the site. While they are on-site, King County is not able to direct their work, where they park, or if their trucks are idling.
- Temporary outages may be required. Utility agencies should inform impacted residents of any upcoming outages, and we will do our best to keep you updated on dates and times for planned outages when we can.

Construction progress and updates

- *Sitework:* Crews continue to lay pipe to connect wastewater infrastructure. Boring for a new manhole will be completed this week.
- *CSO Tank:* Crews will install drain vault piping and pumps. The large crane on site will be removed by Monday, June 22.
- *Mechanical/electrical building:* Last week the building was connected to the new, permanent power system. Crews continue working on the building interior, including drywall and electrical equipment.
