Construction begins on King County's new South Magnolia CSO Control Facility!

King County's contractor is beginning construction on a new combined sewer overflow (CSO) control facility in Magnolia. A 1.5 million gallon underground tank will store excess flows of stormwater and sewage when heavy rains fill pipes, reducing untreated overflows to Puget Sound.

King County's contractor will begin construction by installing power, water, and sewer connections to the storage facility site. On Monday, March 31, crews will begin work on West Marina Place to install an underground power line extending from a location near Palisades Restaurant to the County's project site. Crews will be working in the road right-of-way, along the eastbound lane of West Marina Place and the northbound lane of 23rd Avenue West.



What you can expect

- Expect delays! Traffic will be detoured around the work, and one-lane traffic can be expected.
- People should drive slowly in the area and watch for flaggers and signs.
- Crews will work weekdays from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and may work Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
