Restoration work continuing on West Galer Street and 32nd Avenue West

June 18, 2018

King County's contractor is continuing the restoration phase of the pipeline remediation project. Crews are working on West Galer Street and 32nd Avenue West.

West Galer Street

Beginning the week of June 11, the contractor began drilling activities to install monitoring wells. These wells will replace two wells damaged by drilling, and allow evaluation of any soil loss along the pipeline deep under the West Galer Street right-of-way.

The contractor expects to continue well installation through the end of the week of June 18. The following week, a geotechnical contractor will carry out evaluation work using a method residents have seen previously, cross-hole tomography. These activities will require traffic control along West Galer Street. Monitoring and surveying activities will continue throughout the completion of the restoration work.

Work on West Galer Street is expected to continue until the end of July.

What you can expect:

- Work hours extend from 7:00 a.m. until 5:30 p.m.; however, longer hours may be needed to complete specific activities.
- Drilling activities involve increased noise in the area of work.
- Two-way traffic will be maintained, but lanes will be shifted and traffic will be directed around the work site.
- Bicycles will travel with vehicle traffic.
- Crews, lighting, and trucks will be located in the right-of-way.
- **Please drive slowly and obey signs and flaggers!**



32nd Avenue West

King County's contractor is continuing work to restore the upper diversion structure that sends excess flow from the City of Seattle's system to the Magnolia Wet Weather Facility. This work is expected to continue into August, and includes restoration of structures associated with the diversion structure. The work area will be focused around the upper diversion structure, with additional lay down area close to the site.

Brief traffic delays may occur for delivery of materials and equipment. Crews will work from about 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on weekdays.

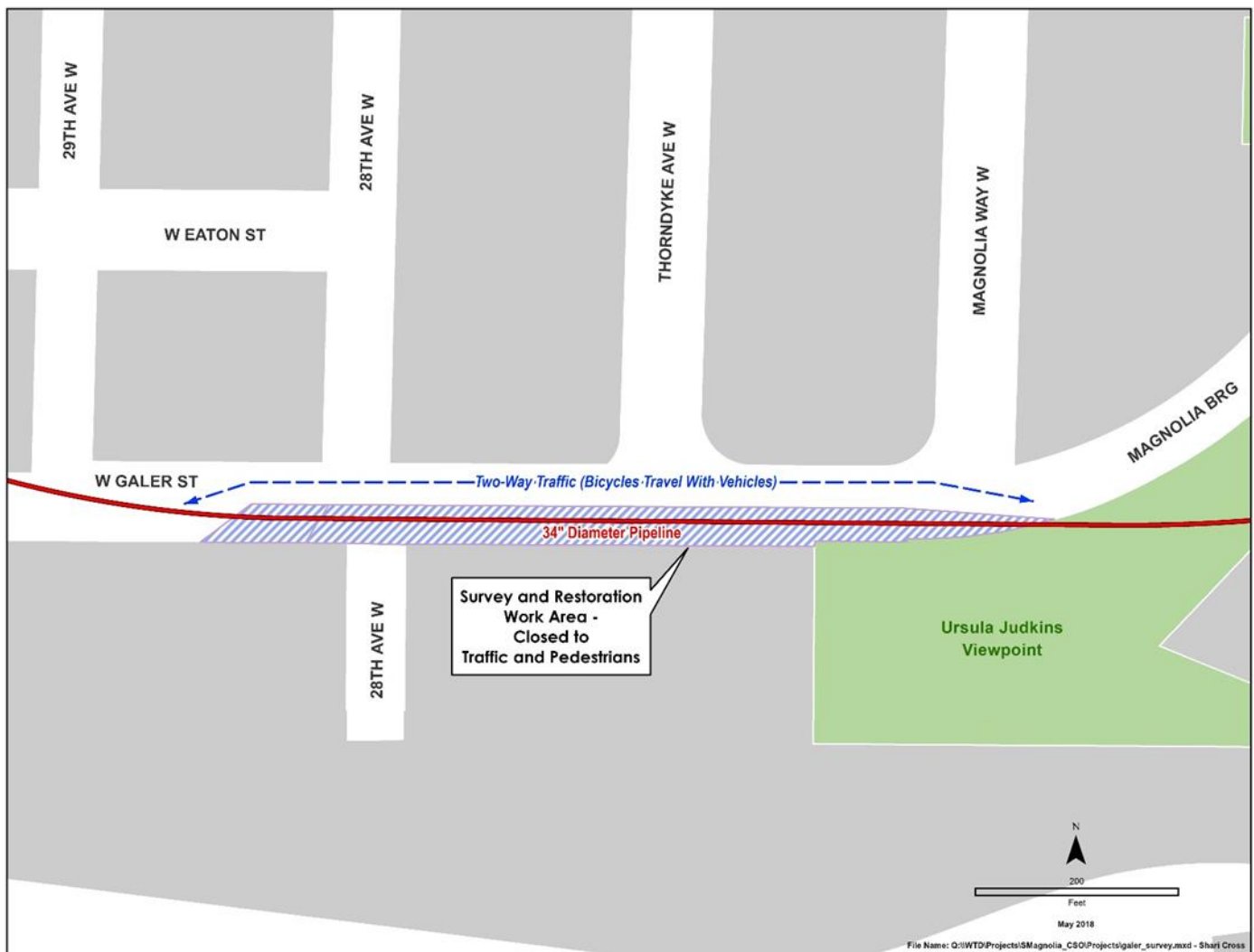
