

Project update November 23, 2016

Night time drilling as early as Monday, Nov. 28

Workers will drill on weeknights on the McDonalds property

During the week of November 28, workers will be drilling to collect groundwater and soil samples for analysis. They will be working at the McDonalds property, 6145 4th Ave. S., and will conduct the work at night to avoid business disruptions.

This work will help evaluate and refine the final design of the Georgetown Wet Weather Treatment Station project.
When constructed, the station can treat up to 70 million gallons of

combined rain and wastewater a

day that would otherwise have discharged directly to the Duwamish without treatment during storm events.

What to expect:

- Work hours between 11:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m.
- Workers on site for five nights, with drilling taking place for approximately three of those nights.
- Noise will be similar to typical traffic noise along 4th Avenue.
- No expected traffic impacts.
- Security and staff on site.
