

Construction Update

February 22, 2018

Crews installing utility monitoring points in the street starting the week of March 5

Starting the week of March 5, crews will install four utility monitoring points. Two monitors will be installed in the curbside westbound lane on S. Michigan St. and another two in the curbside northbound lane on E. Marginal Way S.

Work in the roadway is expected to take up to three days, sometime between March 5 and March 16.

The monitors on E. Marginal Way will be installed during the day. Northbound traffic will be reduced to two lanes, two-way traffic will be maintained at all times.

Monitors on S. Michigan St. will be installed overnight. The contractor received a noise variance to complete the install work between March 5 and March 16.

What to expect between March 5 and March 16:

- Work overnight on S. Michigan St., expected to last up to three days
- Daytime work on E. Marginal Way S. between normal work hours, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Lane closures on E. Marginal Way S. on S. Michigan St.
 - Two-way traffic will be maintained
 - Crews will have signs and flaggers to safely direct traffic around the work area
 - Traffic delays near work zones can be expected.
- Increased noise
