The Interbay Sewer and Odor Control Upgrade Project

King County's Wastewater Treatment Division plans to upgrade an aging sewer pipe in Seattle's Interbay neighborhood. The existing pipe was built in 1967 and is nearing the end of its service life. The upgrade will be to approximately one mile of the pipeline system extending from the Magnolia Bridge to just north of the Interbay Athletic Complex (see map below). The County expects construction to start in 2022.

The County will add new odor control technology to the system while the sewer pipe upgrade is underway. When complete, the sewer will provide reliable service for another 50 years or more.

We will be back in touch with you as we work through the design process and prepare for 2020 construction.




Pipe repair to start soon for the Interbay Sewer and Odor Control Upgrade Project

Starting as soon as mid-July, King County will reinforce a small, 200-foot section of sewer pipe on West Garfield Street and under the Magnolia Bridge. The County needs to do this work before it upgrades the entire mile-long section of pipe in 2022 (see above).

The work will take approximately three months to complete and will not impact access to the Magnolia Bridge or its on and off ramps.
