King County Sewer Upgrade Project in Your Neighborhood

Dear Resident,

King County Wastewater Treatment Division will replace ageing sewer pipelines in your neighborhood to continue providing reliable sewer service to your community. For most of your homes, the water you use travels through your sewer pipes to the City of Redmond's pipes. King County collects wastewater from the City of Redmond and sends it to the Brightwater Treatment Plant in Woodinville.

The sewer line in your area travels through a residential neighborhood, including streets, a ravine, and some backyards. We know that you will have questions and concerns about where the new pipeline will be built and how it might affect you. King County's project team is committed to keeping you informed and up to date, and addressing your questions about the project. We will start working with your neighborhood at two meetings scheduled in early February:
