



NORTH MERCER ISLAND/ENATAI Sewer Upgrade Project

June 1, 2016

King County begins field investigations at North Mercer Island and Southwest Bellevue in June 2016

King County Wastewater Treatment Division is designing a project to upgrade the County's sewer pipelines on North Mercer Island and Southwest Bellevue. The project team starts design by investigating what is underground. That information helps define a final location for the pipeline. On the reverse, you will find a map of the recommended alternative. Crews will gather information throughout the area shown on the map.

Next week, survey crews will start the effort by mapping the area and installing small markers as control points. Utility location crews will mark locations of underground gas, water, power, sewer, and communications lines.

In early June, King County's designers will carry out a survey of the lake bottom traveling east from about 97th Avenue Southeast on Mercer Island to the Enatai shoreline.

In Summer 2016, crews will use drill rigs to look at soil and groundwater conditions. They will install equipment to measure groundwater in some locations.

What you can expect

Survey crews will be working on streets, along the I-90 Trail, in Enatai Beach Park and in residential areas along the pipeline route. During the boat survey, waterfront residents may see the boat near docks where King County's existing pipeline is located.

We will be working with your community every step of the way. If you are a project neighbor, you may receive notification by mail or door hanger. ***Please contact us if you do not wish to receive door hangers.***
