Environmental Review

Enclosed is a copy of the Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) prepared by King County Wastewater Treatment Division for the Sunset and Heathfield Pump Stations and Force Main Upgrade Project. This project is scheduled to begin construction in Spring 2017. This is being sent to you for your review and comments because you are a near neighbor of the project.

The State Environmental Policy Act provides a way to identify possible environmental impacts that may result from governmental decisions. An environmental checklist for the Sunset and Heathfield Pump Stations and Force Main Upgrade Project has been prepared. It covers potential impacts of the project on the natural and built environments, including earth, air, water, plants and animals, environmental health, noise, land use, recreation, light and glare, aesthetics and transportation.

Through this environmental review process King County has determined that this project will not have significant adverse environmental impacts. King County has issued a DNS, which is a formal announcement of the results of the SEPA process. We are mailing this notice to property owners within 500 feet of the proposed project and others on the project mailing list.
