Utility upgrades at the Heathfield Pump Station scheduled to begin Wednesday, June 29

Starting as early as Wednesday, June 29, Puget Sound Energy (PSE) will be conducting work to upgrade the electrical system at King County's Heathfield Pump Station. This work is needed to maintain the existing transformer system that powers the pump station. Upgrades are planned to be complete by the end of the day on Friday, July 1.

A PSE crew will work within the pump station property and on the power lines in front of the pump station on 163rd Ave SE between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. Neighbors can expect increased noise and activity while upgrades are underway. Noise may be more noticeable on Friday, July 1, as the onsite generator will need to be turned on to power the pump station while electrical systems are switched over. PSE crews will park vehicles along 163rd Ave SE near the entrance to the pump station during work hours.

What to expect

- Work from Wednesday, June 29 – Friday, July 1.
- Work hours between 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Work within the pump station property and on power lines in front of the pump station on 163rd Ave SE.
- Increased activity.
- Increased noise, particularly when the generator is running.
- PSE vehicles parked along 163rd Ave SE near the entrance to the pump station.
