Construction Update: September 27th - Vasa Creek Update; W Lake Sammamish Pkwy SE overnight closure; open cut along SE Eastgate Way

Update on Vasa Creek

Vasa Creek continues to flow through the bypass around the two sink holes near the bridge on 164th Pl SE. On Wednesday, King County and its contractor met with the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and representatives from the City of Bellevue to discuss the restoration of the section of Vasa Creek where the two sink holes appeared on Monday. King County is also providing information about the situation to the US Army Corps of Engineers, Ecology, and the Tribes. The regulatory agencies provided King County with guidance on how to restore the creek. While the contractor completes the restoration work, they will also conduct an investigation on what caused the sink holes. We will continue to update you in our regular construction updates as the work progresses.

W Lake Sammamish Pkwy SE full overnight closure beginning late on October 12th

Crews will close W Lake Sammamish Pkwy SE overnight while they remove a large generator from the Sunset Pump Station.

What to expect:

- Crews will close W Lake Sammamish Pkwy SE in both directions from Sunset Pump Station to the intersection of SE 38th St.
- The closure will last from 11 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 12 to 7 a.m. on Saturday, Oct. 13.
- Drivers will be able to turn left from SE 38th St onto W Lake Sammamish Pkwy SE.

Open cut across SE Eastgate Way

Over the last several months, crews have been installing pipe along SE 35th Pl. This week, crews began to install pipe via open cut across SE Eastgate Way. Both lanes of traffic are currently open, but expect slight delays as flaggers help you move safely through the area.
