

East Side Interceptor Lining Project

Conveyance System Improvements in Renton

Eastside Interceptor Lining Project - update for the week of Nov 14-20

The Eastside Interceptor (ESI) is one of the main sewer lines that brings wastewater from eastside homes and business to the South Treatment Plant in Renton. This project will repair about 3,700 feet of the line, which is corroded and nearing the end of its service life (see map, below).

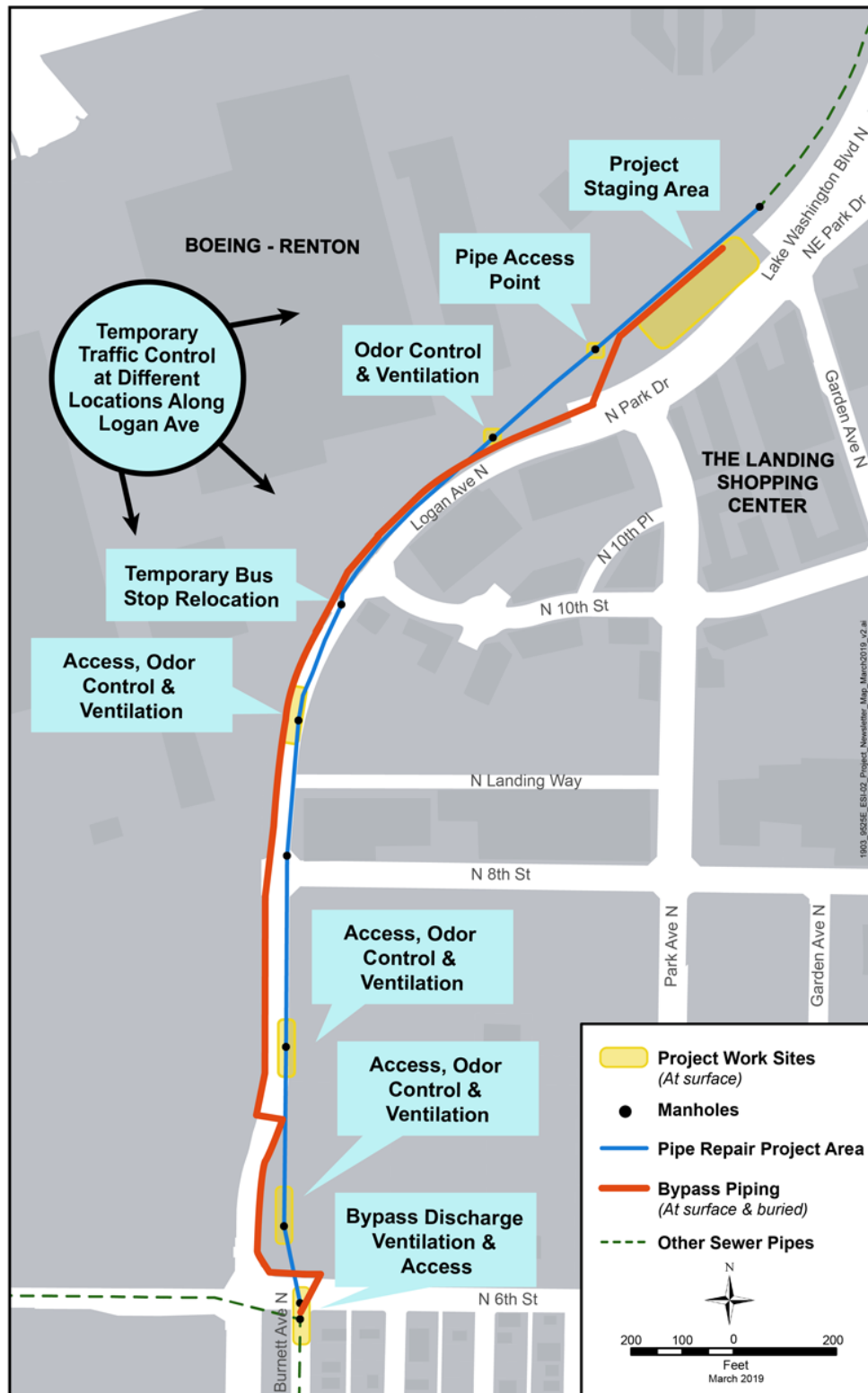
For November 14-20, 2019:

- **Current and upcoming work:** Lining work is now finished and the bypass sewage flows have been returned to the Eastside Interceptor pipe. Ongoing work includes:
 - Taking apart and removing the bypass pipe, including under roadway crossings.
 - Removing temporary work areas, including at Burnett Avenue North & North 6th Street.
 - Restoration, sidewalk and street repair.
- **Temporary lane closures and traffic control** along Logan Avenue continue this week, primarily at night. This allows crews to remove the bypass pipe from underneath roadway crossings.
- **Work hours:** To avoid traffic disruptions, much work is now being done overnight Monday-Saturday, but daytime work continues as needed.
- **Odor control:** There are no longer ongoing odors associated with the lining work; however there may be slight and temporary odors at the manholes, and while dismantling of the bypass pipe and restoring work areas. ***Note: the ventilation and odor control at Burnett and North 5th Street will be operating overnight tonight, November 14.***
- **Barriers along Logan Avenue:** This is an active construction area – do not touch or cross the barriers or walk through the work area. Please cross the street to find safe areas to walk.
- **The bike lane along Logan Avenue** between Park Avenue and North 6th Street is closed due to construction. Please cross over to the east side of Logan Avenue or take an alternate route. The bike lane is scheduled to reopened later this month.
- **The work area at Burnett Avenue and North 6th Street:** Over the next few weeks expect activity here, as the work area is being dismantled and removed.
