

Eastside Interceptor Lining Project

Project update for Dec. 23, 2019 through Jan. 8, 2020

Note: there will be no work from December 25, 2019 through January 5, 2020.

Work will resume on Monday, January 6, 2020

The Eastside Interceptor (ESI) is one of the main sewer lines that brings wastewater from eastside homes and business to the South Treatment Plant in Renton. This project is repairing about 3,700 feet of the line, which is corroded and nearing the end of its service life (see map below).


- Current and upcoming work: Lining work is now finished, the bypass pipe has been removed, and the trailers and most of the equipment have been removed from the project staging area. Ongoing work includes:
- Restoration, sidewalk, crosswalk, and street repair: this work is weather dependent. Final street paving, grinding and overlay will be done this spring.
- Temporary lane closures and traffic control: there will be temporary lane closures as necessary to complete the street and sidewalk restoration.
- The bike lane along Logan Avenue has been reopened
- The work area at Burnett Avenue and North 6th Street has been removed and the street is reopened.
