***North Creek Interceptor construction update:  
Canyon Park Business Center***

**Restoration and paving on 20th Ave. SE**

On Monday February, 4, King County's contractor will begin paving the two lanes on the east side of 20th Avenue SE just north of 220th Street SE.

Work will be taking place in the travel lanes on the east side of 20th Ave. SE. During this work the two lanes on the west side of 20th will be open, both north and south, and traffic will be directed to these lanes.

***There will be one lane in each direction; signage will direct traffic through the work area.***


This work includes temporary paving; permanent paving will be installed in the spring, when the weather is warmer and drier.

**What to Expect During This Work**

- Traffic control and the lane changes will start at about 9:00 a.m. on Monday, February 4
- Work hours will be 7:00 am.to 3:30 pm, weekdays.
- The work is expected to last up to three weeks.
- Commuters may experience short delays during this work.
- There will be one driveway closure, but all business will have one or more entries which will remain open.
- Pedestrians may be directed around the work area.
