# Voter registration information

#### Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- · A citizen of the United States;
- · A legal resident of Washington State;
- · At least 18 years old by Election Day; and
- Not under the authority of the Department of Corrections.

#### How to register

- Register online with the Secretary of State, www.vote.wa.gov.
- Download a registration form from the King County Elections website and return it by mail.
- Register in person at the King County Elections office or Voter Registration Annex.

# Registration deadlines

While you may register to vote at any time, there are registration deadlines prior to each election. The deadlines for the April 26, 2016, special election:

- March 28 Deadline to register to vote online or by mail, or update existing voter registration information.
- April 18 In-person registration deadline for people not currently registered in Washington. Register in person at the King County Elections office or at the Voter Registration Annex.

# Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply submit a new registration form to update your information.

# **Ballot information**

On Tuesday, April 26, 2016, in King County, Washington, there will be held a special election conducted entirely by mail for the purpose of submitting to the voters for their approval or rejection the ballot measures as listed.
