

Voter registration information

Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States;
- A legal resident of Washington State;
- At least 18 years old by Election Day;
- Not under the Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction; and
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order.

How to register

- Register online with the Secretary of State, [www.vote.wa.gov](http://www.vote.wa.gov).
- Download a registration form from the King County Elections website and return it by mail.
- Register in person at the King County Elections office or Elections Annex.

Registration deadlines

While you may register to vote at any time, there are registration deadlines prior to each election. The deadlines for the February 13, 2018, special election are:

- **Jan. 15** – Deadline to register to vote online or by mail, or update existing voter registration information.
- **Feb. 5** – In-person registration deadline for people not currently registered in Washington. Register in person at the King County Elections office or at the Voter Registration Annex.

Keep your voter registration current

Update your registration if you have moved or changed your name, or if your signature has changed. Simply update your information online or submit a new registration form.

Ballot information

On Tuesday, February 13, 2018, in King County, Washington, there will be held a special election conducted entirely by mail for the purpose of submitting to the voters for their approval or rejection the ballot measures as listed.
