Requirements

To register to vote in Washington, you must be:

- A citizen of the United States;
- A legal resident of Washington State;
- At least 18 years old by Election Day;
- Not under Department of Corrections supervision for a Washington felony conviction; and
- Not disqualified from voting due to a court order.

How to register

Online

You can register or update your registration online at www.vote.wa.gov — you'll need a Washington State Driver License or ID. Make sure you register online by the March 2 deadline for the March 10 Presidential Primary Election.

By mail

Download and print a registration form to register or update your registration from www.kingcounty.gov/elections and mail it to our office by the March 2 deadline for the March 10 Presidential Primary Election.

In person

You can register in person through March 10, Election Day at a vote center. For more information on locations and hours of vote centers, visit www.kingcounty.gov/elections.

Ballot Information

On Tuesday, March 10, 2020 in King County, Washington, there will be held a presidential primary election conducted entirely by mail.

Replacement ballot

Call King County Elections to obtain a replacement ballot if your original ballot packet is lost, spoiled, or destroyed.
