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### Purpose



#### The purpose of this grant is to provide support to organizations that:

- Promote digital equity in communities that face barriers to accessing digital services;
- Serve communities that have been disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic

#### These communities include but are not limited to:

- o Black, Indigenous, People of Color (BIPOC);
- Seniors;
- o Limited English Proficient (LD)/Linguistically Diverse (LD) residents;
- Individuals with disabilities and communication barriers
- Low-income;
- Unemployed and underemployed residents;
- o those experiencing houselessness; OR
- o those residing in rural areas.

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### Eligibility



#### To be eligible for this grant, applicants must:

- o Be a 501(c)(3) or be fiscally sponsored by a 501(c)(3) based in King County; and
- o Demonstrate experience and proximity and serving priority populations

#### Applicants may include but are not limited to following:

- Community- or faith-based organizations;
- Ethnic/Community media organizations;
- o Community, senior, or ethnic centers;
- Disability service providers;
- Local education agencies;
- Volunteer literacy agencies;
- School, libraries, or other anchor institutions;
- Public housing authorities;
- Consortiums or coalitions of agencies, organizations, institutions, libraries, and authorities listed above;
- o Partnerships between employers and an entity described above.

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### Eligibility (Cont.)



#### **IMPORTANT:**

If you are currently receiving any federal funding to expand digital access from another government or pass-through entity, you **may** not be eligible to receive funds through this grant program.

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### Allowable use of funds



#### Eligible expenses and activities include but are not limited to:

#### Technology, interactive media, and services:

Purchasing Wi-Fi; new or refurbished Internet-enabled devices;
 subsidized or pre-paid services plans; software, etc.

#### **Technical Assistance and Training:**

 Staffing; purchasing teaching equipment, technology to help individuals with disabilities, translation of existing curricula and outreach materials; distance-learning tools and platforms; storage devices, etc.

#### Administrative and other direct costs:

 Staffing and personnel for instruction or volunteer recruitment and management; purchasing personal protective equipment (PPE) for inperson or on-site services; proper ventilation, physical barriers, etc.; acquisition and ongoing maintenance of hardware and software, etc.

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### **Grant details**



#### Grants will range from \$25,000 to \$100,000 and determined based on:

- Size of request
- o Capacity of the organization
- Geographic priority
- o Total application turnout and alignment with the program intent

#### Council appropriated funds through December 31, 2022

- All grant activities must take place between March 3rd, 2021 and December 31st, 2022.
- o Funds must be expended by December, 31st 2022.

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## Selection Criteria (100 pts)



#### **Scope of Work (30 points)**

Alignment with the goals and objectives in the program SOW

#### Equity (30 points)

Approach ensures equitable outcomes and access

#### Feasibility (20 points)

o Feasibility to carry out activities and produce intended outcomes

#### **Evaluation Plan (5 points)**

o Clearly articulates how it achieve program outputs and outcomes

#### **Collaborative Elements (10 points)**

o Plan to partner or collaborate with other community organizations

#### **Budget (5 points)**

Budget is complete, aligns with proposed activities

**Registration:** In order to access the application, all applicants must first register an eCivis account - <u>Register</u>

**Deadline:** Tuesday, November 30th, 2021 @ 4:59pm PST

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### **Grant Timeline**



Open Application: Friday, October 20th, 2021

Application Deadline: Tuesday, November 30th, 2021 @ 4:59pm PST

Award Notification: Mid-January 2022

Contracting: January - February 2022

Implementation: March 3rd, 2021 - December 31st, 2022

#### **Important:**

- Funds will be disbursed to through a reimbursement process based on a monthly or quarterly invoices and supporting documentation.
- Recipients are responsible for meeting administrative, financial record keeping, and programmatic reporting requirements (2 CFR 200).
- Advance payments for equipment purchases can be made available but must be negotiated on a case-by-case basis and permitted in the signed agreement.
