

# STOP COVID FROM SPREADING

## COMPLY WITH COVID-19 REQUIREMENTS FOR RESTAURANTS

- Teach workers about COVID-19 policies. Post signs or do trainings.




- Ask employees about COVID-19 symptoms every day. If they have symptoms, they must stay home and get tested. Call your healthcare provider or the King County COVID-19 Call Center at 206-477-3977 for testing information.



- Employees must properly wear face coverings at all times.




- Employees must stay 6 feet apart from others at all times.



- Require frequent and thorough handwashing. Provide soap and paper towels.



- Follow proper cleaning and sanitation procedures:



Clean and sanitize all surfaces at least hourly or as needed.



Replace utensils for salad bars and buffets hourly.




Clean and disinfect restrooms frequently.




Clean and sanitize tables, condiment containers, and menus after every customer.

- Reduce seating:**  
Outdoor seating: Allowed in Phase 1, 2 and 3.



Indoor Seating: Phase 3: 50% capacity or less. 10 guests or fewer per table, no household restrictions. Tables must be at least 6 feet apart.

- Seating at bar counters is not allowed.**  
Close off bar counter area to prevent use.




- Inform customers they must wear face coverings** unless they can't because of a medical condition. Suggest or offer other options to customers without a face covering.



Customers are not required to wear face coverings while eating.

- Ask customers to stay 6 feet apart from others** and it is recommended restaurant seat customers from separate groups at least 6 feet apart.



- Have a plan to obtain and maintain voluntary customer contact information for 30 days to help with contact tracing.** Customer participation is optional. Collect customer name, phone number or email address; date and time of meal.
