

MINUTES MAKE THE DIFFERENCE

EARLY RECOGNITION

On average, 4 people will experience an OHCA every day in King County. Most cardiac arrests occur in private residences. Recognizing an OHCA is key to initiating the chain of survival.

DISPATCH

BLS

EMS personnel are rapidly dispatched to the OHCA location when 9-1-1 is activated. Dispatchers assist callers to start CPR within 60 seconds of recognition. For every minute CPR is delayed, there is a 5-10% decrease in survival.

EMT/firefighters arrive on scene on average 5 minutes after being dispatched. They deliver high performance CPR and defibrillation when needed.

ALS

Paramedics arrive on scene within 8 minutes after being dispatched. Paramedics provide lifesaving treatment by administering medication, placing IV/IO and managing the patient's airway.

Once a patient has a stable heartbeat, paramedics with the assistance of EMT/firefighters, rapidly transport the patient to a nearby hospital. Hospitals have the ability to perform lifesaving invasive procedures such as cardiac catheterization.

Resuscitation is ultimately life-affirming. It is an ennobling act that reveals much about our society's values -- namely that human life has value.
