

## Project overview





Remove and replace 1.59 miles of NE Stillwater Road/Kelly Road NE from State Route 203 to NE Big Rock Road

## Why



- Pavement and soil supporting the pavement (subgrade) are in poor condition.
- When subgrade is too soft, the weight of traffic causes subgrade to shift. This shift causes ruts, dips and cracks in the road.
- King County has patched up the ruts and cracks over the years. It is now time for a full road replacement.

## What




- Remove 1.59 miles of road between SR 203 and NE Big Rock Road.
- Excavate the entire road, rebuild the subgrade with hard-packed crushed gravel and soil, and repave the road.

### How




- Close and rebuild one section of road at a time.
- Maintain local access
- Detour through traffic





# Signed Detours


#### **Throughout construction:**

- We will monitor Fay Road NE, and the intersection of Fay Road NE and SR 203, for speeding and traffic backups at the intersection.
- King County and WSDOT will work together to make changes as needed to help keep traffic moving.













## New information: Local access only 24/7



- **Road closures:** The road will be closed to general through traffic around the clock starting Aug. 2 through fall 2021.
- **Weekends:** For safety reasons, the road will NOT open to general pass-through traffic on weekends.
- At least half of the entire length of road will be under construction.
- Much of the road will be gravel, un-paved and bumpy
- It is safer for general pass-through traffic to use detour route
- Local access ALWAYS will be allowed




## New information: Combine zones to stay on time



- Contractor will combine zones to complete all work before rainy season
- Zones A/B: Aug/September
- Zones C/D: September/October




### New information



- Construction road closure begins: Aug. 2.
- ZONE A AND ZONE B AT THE SAME TIME
- ZONE C AND ZONE D AT THE SAME TIME
- All local traffic may enter from either access
  point SR 203 or Big Rock Road NE at night and
  on weekends.



### What this looks like & how it works



Zone A: SR 203 to NE 94<sup>th</sup> Street

Zone B: NE 94th Street to NE 100th Place

Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.


Access to addresses located within the active construction zones may enter from either SR 203 or NE Big Rock Road.

All others should enter from SR 203 or NE Big Rock Road

#### Nights and weekends

Local access is available during non-active construction.
 However, it is still safer and quicker to use the detour route.
 The new construction zone will be twice as long and covered in gravel.

### What this looks like & how it works



Zone C: NE 100th Place to 325th Avenue NE

Zone D: 325th Avenue NE to Big Rock Road NE

Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Access to addresses located within the active construction zones may enter from either SR 203 or NE Big Rock Road.

All others should enter from SR 203 or NE Big Rock Road


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

### New information





• **Speed radar sign:** Our traffic engineers will pro-actively record driver speeds on NE Fay Road. We have a speed radar sign reserved in case it is needed to help calm traffic.



 Additional signage: In addition to project information signs, we will add signs directing Camlann Medieval Village visitors to the detour route.




# What else to expect during construction









- **Equipment on roadway:** Expect to see construction equipment on the road.
- General travel delays: Add extra time for detour route and local access route. The detour may add up to an additional 10 minutes.
- Specific travel delays when roadwork is near your home: Prepare to wait up to 10 minutes to get to and from NE Stillwater Hill Rd/Kelly Road NE and your street or driveway.
- **Noise and dust:** Crews will use pavement breakers and jackhammers. You may also hear truck noise and other equipment.

## Lake Joy culvert replacement this summer

What: King County will replace the culvert under Lake Joy Road at NE 118th Place

**How:** Road Services crews will close Lake Joy Road for up to 10 weeks. Residents will use an adjacent temporary bypass road.

When: July 19, 2021 through early fall 2021

Up to six (6) full road closures: August 5-6; 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. both days. Additional closures in late August and early September. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained during each closure.

**Additional information:** Crews will use the Stillwater Pit as a staging area.
