ORDINANCE NO. 10698

AN ORDINANCE relating to archives and records management, amending Ordinance 659, Section 2 and K.C.C. 2.12.020; Ordinance 3606, Section 4 and K.C.C. 2.12.060; repealing and substituting for Ordinance 659, Section 3 and K.C.C. 2.12.030; repealing Ordinance 659, Section 4 and K.C.C. 2.12.040; and adding a new section.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 659, Section 2, as amended, and
K.C.C. 2.12.020 are hereby amended to read as follows:

((A: The-responsibility-for-storage-and-retrieval-of-the records;-including-the-records-of-the-King-County-council;-has been-established-by-the-1971-Appropriations-Ordinance;-and-this chapter-with-the-executive-branch-in-the-records-and-elections division:--B.))

All records of the King County council and records of the King County commissioners, prior to the establishment of the Home Rule Charter, other than office files and memoranda shall be either photographed, microphotographed, photostated or reproduced on film by the records and elections division.

NEW SECTION SECTION 2. A new section is hereby added to Chapter 2.12 K.C.C.:

An archives and records management program is hereby established in the records and elections division. The archives and records management program shall be responsible for:

- A. Maintaining a facility for storage of inactive and archival records.
- B. Establishing standards for records storage media to ensure continued public access to public records during their legal retention period and for preservation of archival information.
- C. Maintaining a directory to current records of county agencies, which shall serve as a public disclosure index as set

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forth in RCW 42.17. A directory of historical, noncurrent or obsolete records designated archival shall serve as an index to King County administrative history, as provided by RCW 40.14.

D. Preserving and providing public access to the archival records of King County.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 659, Section 3 and K.C.C. 2.12.030 are each hereby repealed, and the following is substituted:

A. "County records" means any document Definitions. including any paper, correspondence, completed form, bound records book, photograph, film, sound or video recording, map, drawing, machine-readable material, or other document, regardless of physical form or characteristics, and including copies thereof, that have been made by or received by any agency of King County in connection with the transaction of public business.

"Archival records" are those designated as having В. continuing historical value by the Washington State Archives or King County Archivist.

SECTION 4. Ordinance 659, Section 4 and K.C.C. 2.12.040 are each hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Ordinance 3606, Section 4 and K.C.C. 2.12.060 are amended to read as follows:

Retention of all county records, Retention of records. both public and official records, shall be in accordance with approved records retention schedules established pursuant to RCW ((Active-records,-those-records-utilized-by-an 40.14.070. agency-in-its-daily-operations,-shall-be-maintained-by-that agency---Inactive-or-semiactive-records-at-least-two-years-old and-not-required-by-an-agency-in-its-daily-operations,-but-which must-be-retained-for-a-longer-period-of-time-in-accordance-with approved-retention-schedules,-may-be-stored-in-the-county archives-maintained-by-the-records-and-elections-division.))

The archives and records management program shall provide for the legal retention and disposition policy for county records, including identification of archival records.
