







Daily Live Fish Count & Rainfall



Time Series: Live Fish Observed




Time Series: Coho Pre-Spawn Mortality

How Urban Lands Affect Streams

Stream flow

- Faster, higher flowing water more often
- Less and warmer water in summer

Water pollution

- Warmer, low dissolved oxygen, altered pH, more turbid
- More pollution bacteria, metals, pesticides, oil, salt, etc.

Physical habitat conditions

- Substrate: hardened, more silt/sand, less gravel
- Salmon nests in gravel are smothered
- Streamside vegetation: native, invasive, absent
- Reaches inaccessible to resident and anadromous fish

Things You Can Do: clean up runoff



 Check for oil leaks in your car. Contain leaks until you can get the car fixed.

Wash your car at a carwash or on the lawn.
Keep soap and oil out of the storm sewer and out of the creeks!

Pick up after your pet.

Things You Can Do: leave downed logs & branches in the stream


