



Complaints Reported by Community Members and Sheriff's Office Employees

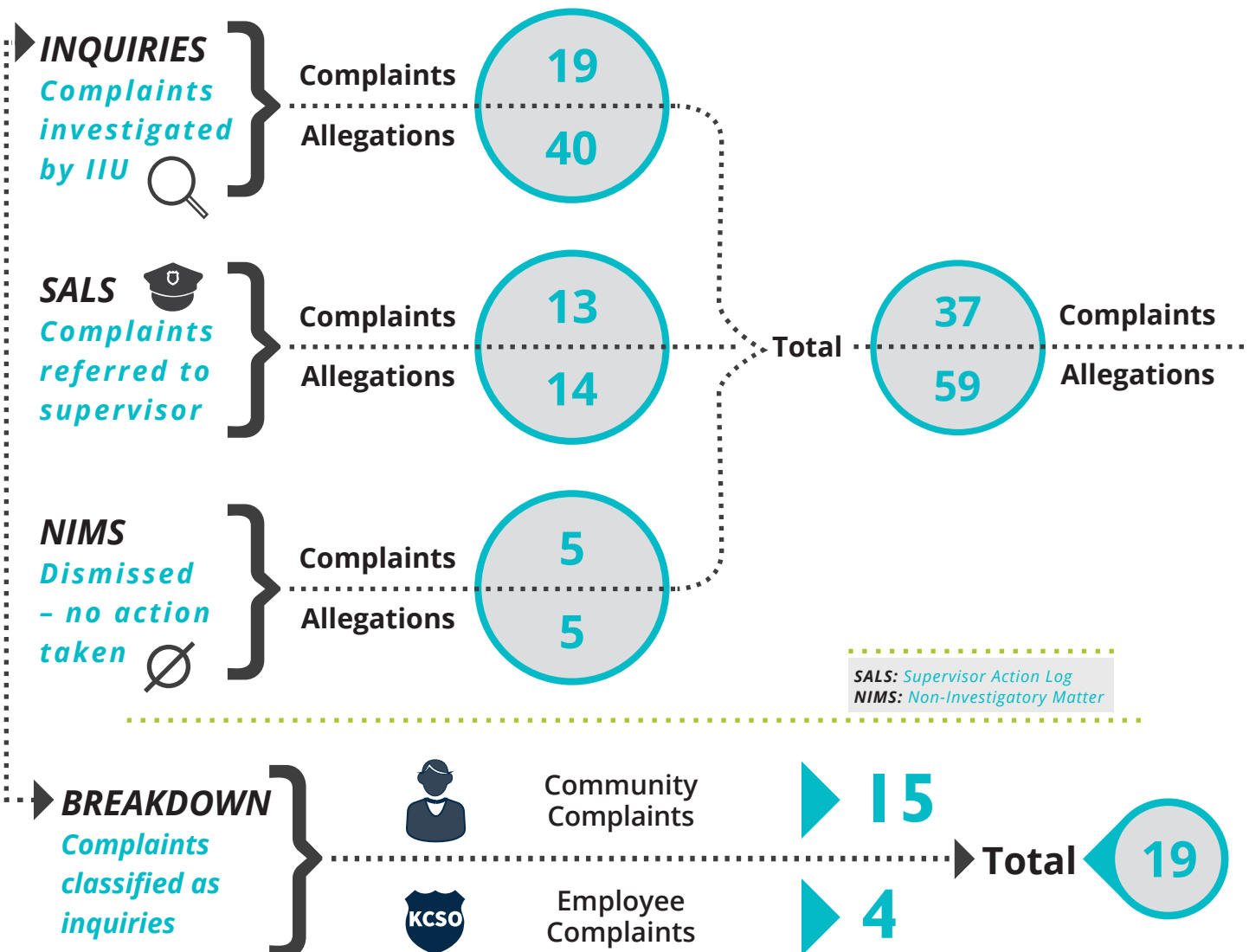
Bottom line: There were 37 complaints reported in 2019 in District 3, and Internal Investigations Unit (IIU) classified 19 of those complaints as inquiries, or serious complaints. Those 19 complaints included 40 allegations of misconduct, with the top allegation being for excessive use of force. IIU did not sustain six of the ten allegations for excessive use of force, and IIU has not completed the investigations for the other remaining excessive use of force allegations.

CASE #	ALLEGATION (#)	NOTES ON ALLEGATION	DISPOSITION	OLEO REVIEW
IU2019-065	Excessive use of force (2)	When deputies responded to a mental crisis call, community member was transported for mental evaluation and he alleged he was illegally imprisoned and brutally arrested with guns drawn; community member also alleged deputies took his property and it was not returned.	Unfounded	Certified
IU2019-341	Excessive use of force (1)	Community member was arrested for DUI. Community member alleged she was grabbed and thrown into a police car causing bruising, and she was berated and teased.	Exonerated	Certified
IU2019-484	Excessive use of force (3)	During a response to a domestic violence call, deputy deployed taser on community member. Community member alleged that he sustained an injury to a previously broken wrist and believed his ribs were broken.	Exonerated	Declined to certify
