# **Northwest Fence Line Survey Report**

October 24, 2022

# **Background:**

The King County International Airport (KCIA) owns a fence line along its northwest perimeter, which abuts Ellis Avenue, S. Albro Pl., Hardy St., and S. Elizabeth St. The goal of this project is to replace that fence line with one which contributes to improving the look and feel of the Georgetown neighborhood while meeting the airport's security needs. This fence is also being relocated slightly to ensure enough space for SDOT to install their multi-use trail, a separate project completed by the city.

The survey results will help guide the airport's leadership in determining a final fence type and will be available on the airport's website. Any artwork in addition to the currently planned 160-foot mural will be addressed in future projects, which will likely start after the end of the SDOT multi-use trail project and through 4culture.

## **Community Engagement Efforts:**

## Community Working Group:

KCIA worked with a community working group to help get valuable input from the communities around our airport. This working group was comprised of five community members and airport representatives. This community working group helped the airport develop three different fence design options before the airport developed the survey to get the opinions of the larger community.

## Georgetown Community Council Meeting:

KCIA attended a Georgetown Community Council Meeting, where our goal was to talk with community members about the fence options that the community working group and airport came up with. This also gave them a chance to take our online survey to provide us with their opinions and feedback. The community members gave the airport good feedback, which was incorporated into the survey based on the discussion at the meeting.

#### **Survey Results:**

Between the survey and social media, KCIA received a total of 97 responses regarding this survey. Of those 97 individuals, **68% of them prefer the Picket Fence overall**. A majority of the survey participants reside in the Georgetown community however there was participation from people who lived in Beacon Hill, Columbia City, South Park, and Tukwila as well.


The survey used a 1 through 5 scales of importance (1 being least important and 5 being most important) when getting the communities opinion on incorporating more artwork into the fence line. The average score for this question was **2.81 out of 5**.

Out of the categories of Visually Pleasing, Visibility, Cost, and matching this fence line with existing fences around KCIA, a majority of people said a **visually pleasing fence is their first choice** while having a fence with **good visibility is their second choice**. Cost and matching the fence line with existing fences around KCIA were people's third and fourth choices.


