ROAD WORK TO BEGIN THIS WEEK

Final step in sewer project starting as early as Wednesday, September 18



King County contractor Miles Resources is scheduled to begin work this week for a full road overlay on streets impacted by the Skyway Infiltration and Inflow Reduction project, which replaced sewer mains and side sewers in the neighborhood in 2011 and 2012. Work this week will focus on field reconnaissance, and paving work will begin Monday, September 22. Work is anticipated to be complete by the end of October.

All roads within the project area (above) will be paved, with the exception of Rainier Avenue South. Paving work will proceed from west to east across the neighborhood, starting on Rustic Road South and moving toward 84th Avenue South. Each block will take approximately two days to complete. The contractor will pave one side of the street the first day and the other side of the street the second day. Streets will remain open during construction.

What you can expect

- Parking will be restricted in the work area from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. No Parking signs will be placed at least 48 hours before paving begins on a street. **Please move your car off the shoulder of the road for the duration of the paving effort on your street.**
- Access will be maintained to all residences. When work is occurring directly in front of driveways, the contractor will work with the resident to manage access.
- Roads will be narrowed to one lane while work is being performed.
- Traffic control, including cones, signs and flaggers, will be used to manage traffic flow.
- Extra travel time when driving through the work zone.
