## **Compliance Monitoring and Administration Fees**

The King County Industrial Waste (KCIW) Program is funded by fees paid by regulated commercial and industrial facilities. Compliance monitoring and administration (CM&A) fees pay for inspections, sampling, laboratory costs, permit management tasks, and administrative functions.

To assess the fee, KCIW uses <u>criteria to place similar facilities into CM&A fee tiers</u>. All facilities in a tier pay the same fee, which reflects the average cost to monitor and administer the permit or discharge authorizations for the facilities in that tier. Tier placement criteria is online at <u>www.kingcounty.gov/industrialwaste</u>.

The fees listed below are KCIW's annual CM&A fees, not monthly sewer use rates. They are paid throughout the year in installments and are included in the bills for sewer service that industrial facilities receive from local sewer agencies.
