### Consent Decree/CSO Control Plan Implementation


- All projects in consent decree are on schedule to achieve their critical milestones
- West Section Sewer Systems Operation Plan submitted to EPA in Sept.
- Consent Decree Annual Report submitted to EPA in Oct.
- Work is under way on the SPU-County Joint Operations and System Optimization Plan

- Completed MOA committing both agencies to development of the Joint Plan
- Staff from both agencies participated in 10 educational activities to improve understanding of each other's system and facilities

### **CSO Control Project Implementation**

 Ballard Siphon project on schedule for completion by end of Dec.





## South Magnolia CSO control project recent achievements

- Completed final design for storage tank
- 5 bids received for storage tank; Notice to Proceed by end of year
- Completed 90% design for conveyance

- Completed final design
- Received 7 bids
- Notice to Proceed to Stellar Construction



# Murray CSO control project recent achievements


- Completed deconstruction work

#### Hanford #1 project area






### Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI) achievements

- Completed agreements with SPU
  - RainWise Program
  - Joint GSI Program Management
- Began modeling and field work for West Michigan and Terminal 115 CSO control projects
  - Geotechnical work under way
  - Models built and calibrated

### RainWise Program





- Joint SPU and WTD Program
  - Water and Land Resources Division providing inspection services
  - 35 projects since June 2013

### Water Quality Assessment

- Scope of work approved by King County Council in September
- A first step is to conduct a thorough review and synthesis of existing data and studies pertaining to water quality in areas where King County CSOs discharge
- Scientific and technical review team expected to be formed in early 2014
