



Purpose of WaterWorks

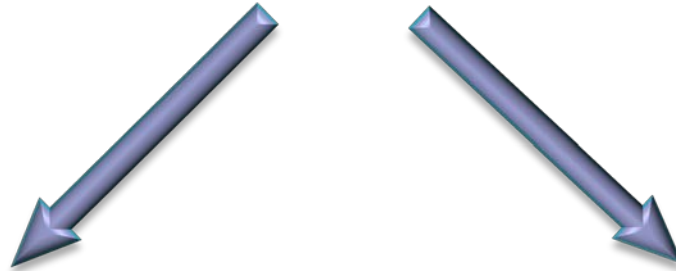
- Provide funding for projects that **improve water quality** in the WTD service area

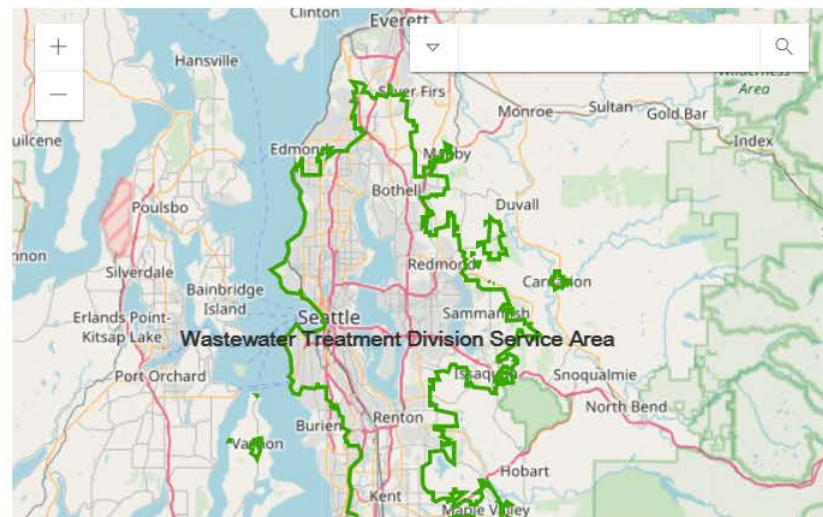

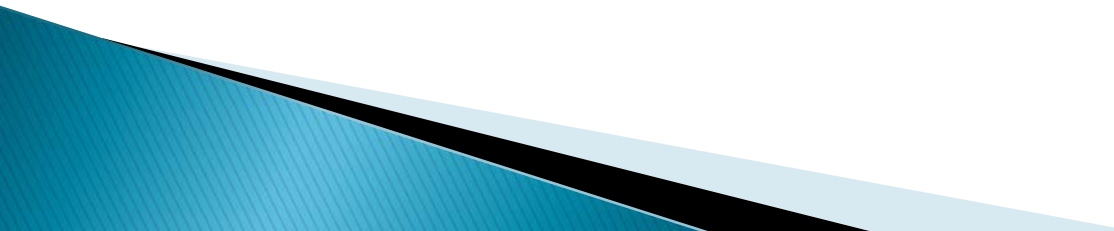

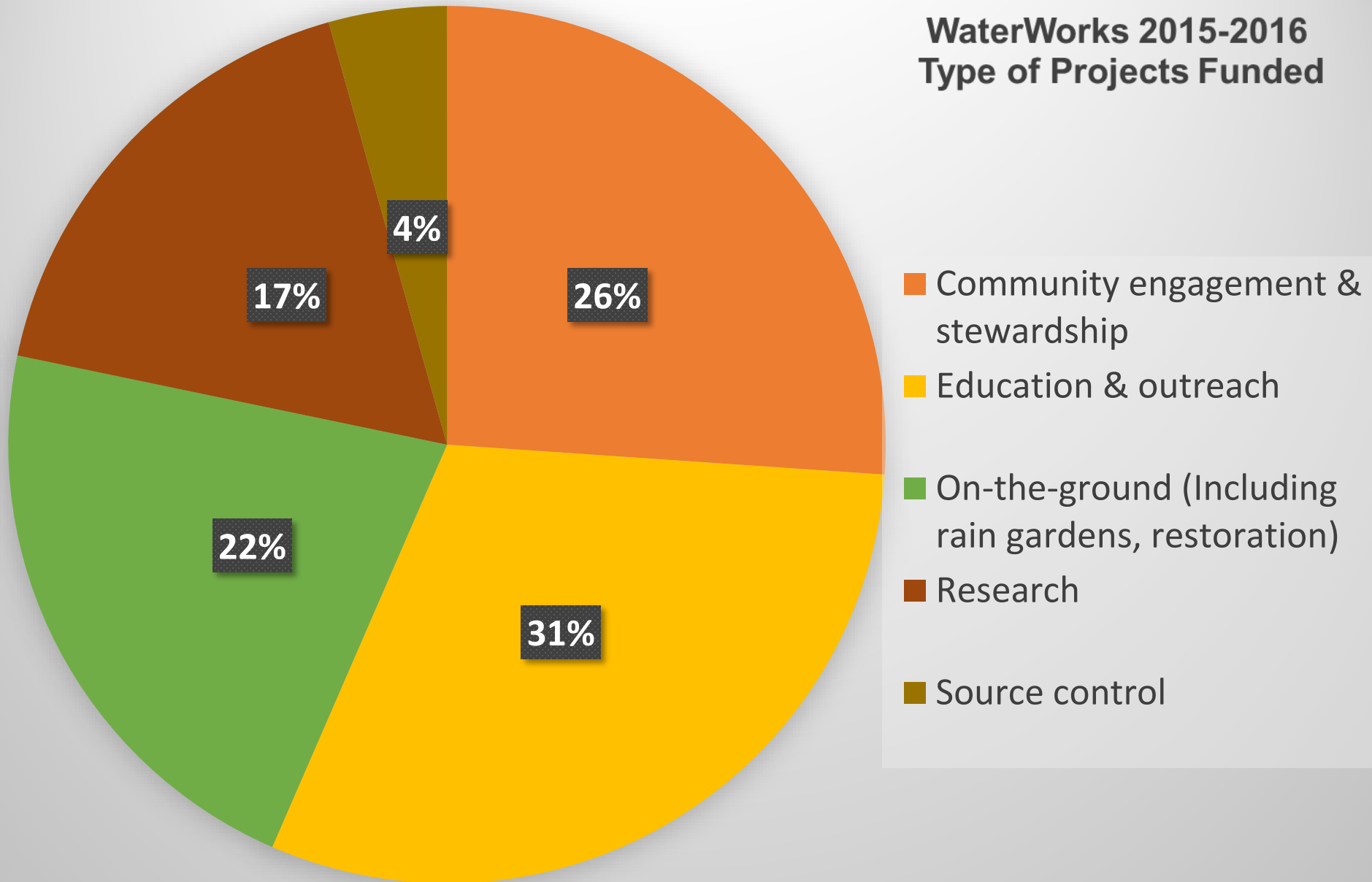

Summer 2018	Projects Start

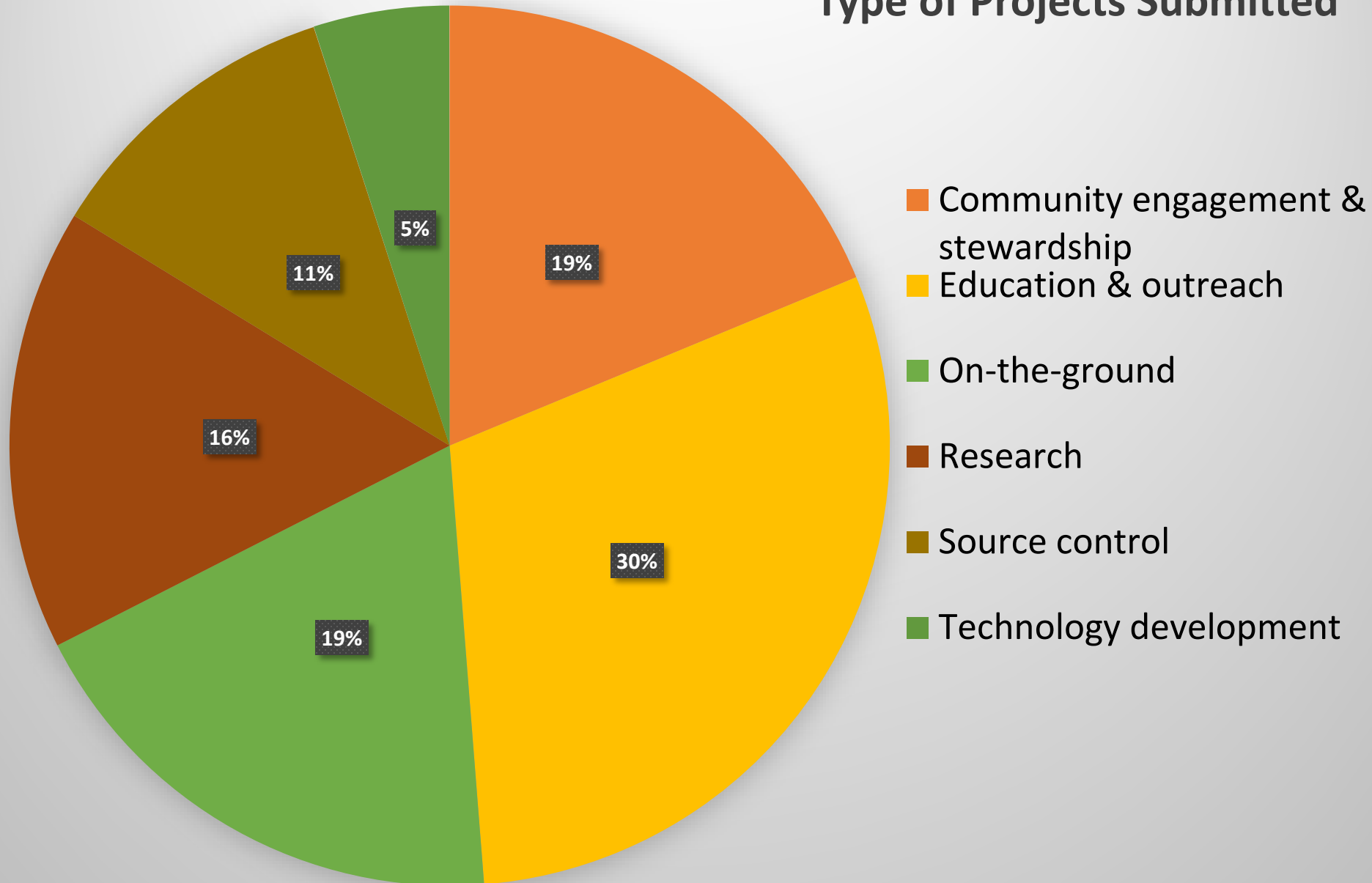
Applications vs. #Projects Funded
