I tried to attach 4 photos to show but your email bounced back that the files were to large. We would hope that you would please put some boulders on Twin Cedars Lane also. Our lane is a very gradual slope to the trail thus allowing cars to easily park. The other driveways are must steeper making it more difficult but were given boulders. Response: Large rocks and guardrail are installed to prevent cars from parking within the trail sight distance triangles. Comment: Also I am curious why some entrances were allowed more plants and beautification while ours was just given attention to the sight distance triangle. Response: Landscaping was generally installed for restoration of temporarily disturbed (construction) areas and to satisfy regulatory requirements (such as critical area mitigation). Landscaping at this driveway is consistent with plantings at other driveways. Comment: Someone put up some stakes and red tape, was that king county? Response: King County did not place cones or tape along this driveway.
