City of Kirkland	Big Finn Hill Park Acquisition	1	\$500,000	Acquire a 4.76-acre parcel adjacent to Big Finn Hill Park that will conserve natural conditions near Denny Creek, extend passive recreational opportunities, and prevent development.
City of Shoreline	Rotary Park Access	1	\$500,000	The acquisition of this parcel would expand upon and leverage the passive recreational use envisioned by the City of Shoreline on property owned by Seattle City Light.
Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation	Colonnade MTB Park Upgrade	2	\$120,000	The Seattle Parks and Recreation Colonnade Mountain Bike (MTB) Park will upgrade a new pump track, jump lines, beginner trails, and features to create a more youth and family-friendly playscape.
Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation	North Rainier Landbank Park	2	\$500,000	This new one-acre park features picnicking, a fitness zone, half-court basketball, and a play area. It prioritizes pedestrian safety/accessibility and addresses stormwater improvements, including 40 new trees.
Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation	Eli's Park Project	2	\$500,000	Initiated and designed by the community, this project will renovate Burke Gilman Playground Park into a regional destination that is fully accessible to people of all abilities.
City of Duvall	Big Rock Ball Fields. Phase II Design	3	\$100,000	Passive and active recreational components, including fields for our youth/adult leagues and beautiful trails and open spaces.
City of North Bend	Meadowbrook Prairie Loop Trail	3	\$500,000	New bicycle and pedestrian trail connecting through Meadowbrook Farm to Snoqualmie Middle School, Centennial Fields Park, and the Meadowbrook Farm Interpretive Center, with interpretive signage and wetland restoration.
City of Redmond	Senior & Community Center	3	\$500,000	Construct a facility to serve the entire community with multigenerational active recreational, arts, events, and gathering areas for year-round opportunities.
Fall City Metropolitan Park District	West Side Trail (Phase I)	3	\$500,000	A shared-use paved trail that enhances public safety for all users, and creates a more walkable community by linking schools and residential areas to downtown Fall City.
Si View Metropolitan Park District	North Bend Connector Trail	3	\$499,999	Construct a 5.65-mile multi-use trail linking Tennant Trailhead Park and Raging River State Forest Trail System, from North Bend to Snoqualmie Point Park.
Si View Metropolitan Park District	Edgewick Connector Trail	3	\$43,037	Construct a non-motorized 0.3-mile gravel trail connecting the Edgewick neighborhood near North Bend to the regional Snoqualmie Valley Trail near Rattlesnake Lake.

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City of Kent	Salt Air Vista Park Renovation	5	\$338,000	Update this neighborhood park with an all-new playground, new swings, and improved neighborhood connections.
City of Kent	Morrill Meadows Park Renovation	5	\$500,000	Renovate the park's playground, grass lawn, trails, and plaza space.
City of Kent	Regional Trails Enhancements	5	\$206,437	Replace and improve informational and wayfinding signage on Kent Regional Trails, including the Green River Trail and Interurban Trail.
City of Tukwila	Tukwila Teen & Senior Center Study	5	\$100,000	Serve the needs of teens and seniors in Tukwila through a community-centered process to include passive and active recreational gathering spaces and gardens.
City of Mercer Island	Luther Burbank Park Pickleball Sport Courts	6	\$193,000	A fifty-year-old sports court will be renovated and reprogrammed to include dedicated tennis and pickleball courts.
City of Auburn Parks and Recreation	Cedar Lanes Park Amenities	7	\$234,925	Add new restrooms, expand parking, storage, and pedestrian paths to Cedar Lanes Bike Park project that is in design.
City of Burien	Burien Community Center HVAC Replacement Project	8	\$500,000	Replace the original 1970 Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning (HVAC) system in the Burien Community Center (BCC) to allow for continued use as a community center and emergency shelter.
Seattle Department of Parks and Recreation	South Park Community Center Site Renovation	8	\$500,000	Includes the installation of a new spray park, play areas, dog off-leash area, sports field, fitness zone, loop trail, basketball court, lighting, and ADA access improvements.
City of Covington	Jenkins Creek Park, Parking, Access, and Restoration	9	\$500,000	Provide the park with a main entrance, dedicated parking, stream/wetland restoration and other improvements to increase access, safety, and environmental stewardship.
City of Newcastle	CrossTown Trail at Lake Boren	9	\$500,000	Build a 0.15-mile trail to complete the missing links in two trails within Lake Boren Park. The trail will provide new connections and offer birdwatching, fishing, and picnicking.
City of Renton	Coulon Park Picnic Floats and ADA Access	9	\$481,050	Replace and enhance two existing picnic floats, ramps, and amenities as part of the Coulon North Water Walk Renovation, providing new ADA access for these unique floating gathering spaces.
