	Change of Venue for State and County Cases from Aukeen to Renton District

The Executive Committee of the King County District Court Judges has met and determined that the caseload at Aukeen District Court is such that they are unable to schedule cases for trial within the time requirements of the existing court rules. Weighted caseload statistics based on 1989 filings show a need for 3.87 judges in order to accommodate that caseload. Aukeen currently has only three judges. It has been necessary to operate four courtrooms daily approximately four days per week in order to accommodate this caseload. After approximately one year's experience in temporarily transferring judges to Aukeen to staff this fourth courtroom, the Presiding Judge has determined that this method of meeting the overload is inefficient. Therefore, pursuant to ARIJ 5 and in order to assure the expeditious and efficient handling of all cases and equal distribution of the workload among the several judges of the district:

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

That within the Service District composed of Renton District Court and Aukeen District Court the judges by local order may change venue of criminal, criminal traffic and traffic cases between those districts as necessary for the ends of justice to see that cases are timely heard.

This order shall take effect immediately.
