	HOUSING			

Revisions:

- Be explicit about outreach to diverse communites; housing should be inclusive and include BIPOD, indigenous, LTGBQ+, refugees, etc
- Included language that housing programs should offer wrap around services such as childcare

Considerations:

- make a separate recommendation to include language to add additional flexible financial support to accommodate needs to maintain and keep housing
- consider requiring that providers complete needs assessments
- make financial asks for short term and long term
- define what "affordable housing" means
- be clear and direct on intent of recommendations; format so that readers are clear on what recommendations and goals are

MENTAL HEALTH: Investing and accessing mental health services throughout KC

Revisions:

• Low income Survivors who have trouble finding providers who accept Medicaid; some providers refuse to take Medicaid due to the way it is paid out

Considerations:

what it would look like if providers were to provide sliding scale payment program/services for survivors?

EDUCATION AND PREVENTION

Revisions:

- Acknowledging that we should further invest and expand in educational and skill based gender based violence programs and programs that are already doing great work
- KC should partner with public schools in KC to highlight gender based violence curriculum and ensure that all youth have access to programs
- Prioritize communites with structural barriers to resources
- Ensuring that we have mental health care that is culturally responsive
- Mattie to create and provide list of Orgs who are already completing this work

ALTERNATIVES TO CRIMINAL LEGAL SYSTEM:

- **Recommendation #1:** Support the creation, implementation, and funding of community-based responses to gender-based violence
- **Recommendation #2:** Support the creation, implementation, and funding of community-based intervention programs for persons causing harm.

Considerations:

Who are the Medical Systems, Orgs, Collectives, Individuals and Governmental folks doing this work?

- What are some initial priorities of potentially building a coalition of supportive entities?
- How would this work be funded?
- How would a continuum of care be built to support survivors and those that do harm?

Recommendation: Increase funding to organizations supporting survivors of gender based violence, prioritizing allocation of new funds to BIPOC-led organizations working outside of the criminal legal system.

Considerations:

- How would funds be distributed?
- What would/could this process look like?
- How could we divest from creating a scarcity dynamic in distributing funds?
 - what do distribution processes look like for funds and grants?
 - Who is involved in interview process for choosing who gets funded?
