1	A RESOLUTION recognizing May 31 as World No
2	Tobacco Day.
3	WHEREAS, the Member States of the World Health Organization created World
4	No Tobacco Day in 1987 to draw global attention to the tobacco epidemic and the
5	preventable death and disease it causes, and
6	WHEREAS, tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable death and disease in
7	King County and in the United States, and
8	WHEREAS, each year in King County, an estimated one thousand seven hundred
9	eighty adults die from smoking-related causes, and
10	WHEREAS, tobacco use in King County results in \$343.1 million in healthcare
11	costs and lost wages every year, and
12	WHEREAS, tobacco use disproportionately affects residents of King County; low
13	income, minority, immigrant, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender populations and
14	residents with no more than a high school education report much-higher tobacco use rates
15	than other populations in the county, and
16	WHEREAS, the 2012 Surgeon General's Report on Preventing Tobacco Use
17	Among Youth and Young Adults indicates that sustained multi-component campaigns
18	including smoke-free public places and efforts to establish smoke-free social norms are

effective in reducing the initiation, prevalence and intensity of smoking among youth and 19 young adults, and 20 21 WHEREAS, tobacco prevention and control is a key component of the Communities Putting Prevention to Work grant with goals of reducing adult tobacco use, 22 reducing youth tobacco initiation, reducing secondhand smoke exposure and reducing 23 24 inequities related to tobacco use, and WHEREAS, the 2012 Surgeon General's Report on Preventing Tobacco Use 25 26 Among Youth and Young Adults indicates that adolescents and young adults are 27 uniquely vulnerable to influences to use tobacco including whether youth perceive 28 tobacco use as normative or acceptable, and 29 WHEREAS, a comprehensive tobacco prevention and control strategy 30 incorporating community interventions including local policies and reinforcing social norms is a best practice identified by the 2007 Best Practices for Comprehensive Tobacco 31 Control Programs guide by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and 32 33 WHEREAS, parks play an important role in contributing to the health and well-34 being of communities by offering low-cost opportunities for physical activity, and are often used by youth organizations such as the YMCA for after-school and summer 35 36 programs, and 37 WHEREAS, the cities of Auburn, Black Diamond, Bothell, Burien, Covington, Kirkland, Mercer Island, Seattle, Shoreline, Snoqualmie, Woodinville, and the Vashon 38 39 parks district, have implemented tobacco-free or smoke-free parks policies to protect their park lands, modeling healthy behavior for users and reinforcing the message that 40 41 parks are safe and healthy places for residents to be active;
