4	WHEREAS, the publ	c health system in Washington provides the foundation for
5	the larger health framework,	working to prevent illness and disease while supporting the
6	work of community partners, and	
7	WHEREAS, tracking	responding to and preventing costly food and water
8	contamination and disease ou	tbreaks is essential to protecting the public's health, and
9	WHEREAS, state and	local public health officials, together with local leaders,
10	have identified an agreed-upo	on set of foundational public health services that should be
11	available for every Washingtonian, and	
12	WHEREAS, no state	or local public health department should be without
13	foundational public health co	mponents and programs which include communicable
14	disease control, chronic disea	se and injury prevention, environmental public health,
15	maternal, child and family he	alth, and access to and linkage with clinical care, and
16	WHEREAS, after a co	entury of increasing life expectancies, these gains are
17	threatened by new and more	complex diseases and emerging threats, putting today's
18	children at risk of becoming t	he first generation to have shorter life expectancies than
19	their parents, and	

WHEREAS, public health's ability to address social and community conditions 20 21 could improve health, life expectancy and quality of life, while also reducing related health care costs and productivity losses, and 22 WHEREAS, the public's well-being is also threatened by public health's inability 23 to meet its basic responsibility to provide those foundational services due to changes in 24 its funding structure, complex and new diseases and growing populations, and 25 WHEREAS, the motor vehicle excise tax was repealed in 2000, leaving the public 26 health system without an adequate and sustainable funding source, and 27 WHEREAS, the Washington state Legislature made an initial investment of \$15 28 million for foundational public health services in the 2017-2019 biennium, representing a 29 one-time, partial restoration of cuts to public health services that were made during the 30 Great Recession, and 31 WHEREAS, due to that funding, Public Health - Seattle & King County: notified 32 partners infected with sexually transmitted diseases; increased partnerships with health 33 care systems to implement best practices that keep patients safe; and expanded 34 35 communicable disease response, and 36 WHEREAS, without securing ongoing, stable, and dedicated funding for 37 foundational public health services, our communities are vulnerable to the spread of communicable diseases like measles, mumps and sexually transmitted diseases; at risk 38 for food, water and environmental health threats; and without resources to adequately 39 track data critical to identifying and responding to emerging threats, and 40 WHEREAS, investing in communities to improve the health and well-being of 41 people could also revitalize and improve economic opportunity, enhancing prosperity in 42

- 43 the community and for its residents and businesses;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Health of King
- 45 County:
- The Board of Health calls on the Washington state Legislature to allocate
- 47 sustainable and

- 48 significant funding necessary to support foundational public health services in all
- 49 communities, and allow public health to continue rebuilding its statewide system with
- 50 added efficiency.
