1. Does the provision for a specialized instruction school in the G zone require a conditional use permit (K.C.C. 21.25.020 (J)(2))?

No. The reference to K.C.C. 21.44 under specialized instruction schools in the G zone is to the "standards" and not to the CUP process itself. This is supported by the separate reference to K.C.C. 21.44 in the G zone under K.C.C. 21.25.020 (K). If specialized instruction schools were intended to go through the CUP process in the G zone, then the separate listing in section .020 would be redundant.

It instructive to note that the AR zone treats specialized instruction schools in an identical way under K.C.C. 21.21A. 040 (F), making reference to "standards" in K.C.C. 21.44. However, the AR zone also contains a separate section for conditional uses (K.C.C. 21.21A.050). If specialized instruction school were to go through the CUP process in the AR zone, then they would have been listed in the conditional use section, resulting in a likewise redundant citation.

## 2. Legislative Update:

1. Proposed ordinance 94-323 amending the sensitive areas code is still under review by GMHE. A revised ordinance is anticipated following additional county and public review by the end of August, 1994.

2. Proposed ordinance 94-324 amending K.C.C. 20.24.090 relating to the hearing examiner process was passed out of GMHE and is before the full council. Amendments to the proposed ordinance are being considered. To date the ordinance would substantially change the hearing examiner process, requiring a showing of "standing," placing time process, requiring a showing of hearings, and allowing for limits on the length of hearings, and allowing for dismissal of examiners without cause. The council plans to act on the ordinance on September 12, 1994.
